## Ingredients

- ☐ 110 g salt
- ☐ 250 g water
- ☐ 1 tbs cream of tartar
- ☐ 250 g plain flour
- ☐ 1 tbs oil coconut, vegetable etc are all fine
- ☐ food colouring
- ☐ glitter optional

## Instructions

### Thermomix Method

1. Place the salt into the Thermomix bowl and mix on Speed 10 for 5 seconds.
2. Scrape down the sides of the bowl.
3. Add the water and cream of tartar and cook for 5 minutes, 60 degrees, Speed 3.
4. Leave to cool for 5 minutes.
5. Add the plain flour and the oil and mix together for 50 seconds, Speed 4.
6. Knead for 1 minute on Interval Speed.
7. Check the texture and if it's a little sticky, add some more flour and knead for a further 30 seconds.
8. Separate the playdough into several bowls.
9. Add 1 tiny drop of food colouring (and a sprinkle of glitter - optional) to each bowl and mix together with your hands until the colour is evenly dispersed (wear gloves!).
10. Wrap the playdough in cling wrap and store in an airtight container in the fridge.

### Conventional Method

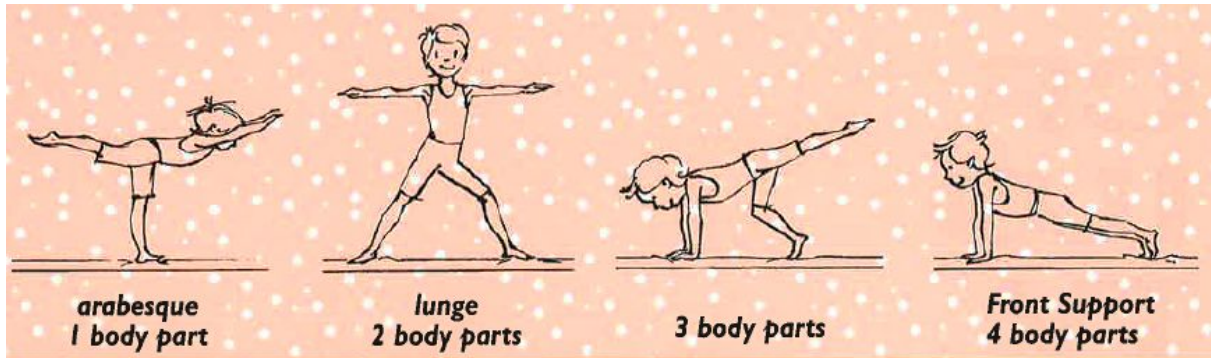
1. Place the flour, water, cream of tartar and salt into a saucepan over medium heat.
2. Stir continuously until thickened. Leave the mixture to cool.
3. Place the dough onto a well-floured board or bench.
4. Add the oil and knead it through really well.
5. Divide the playdough into equal portions, add food colouring and knead until the colour is completely even.
6. Wrap each ball in plastic wrap, place into an airtight container and store in the fridge.

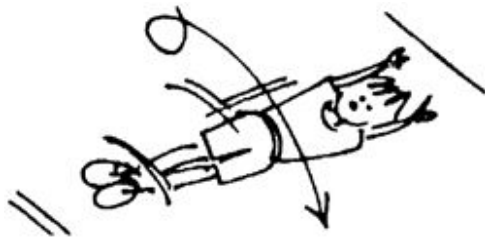

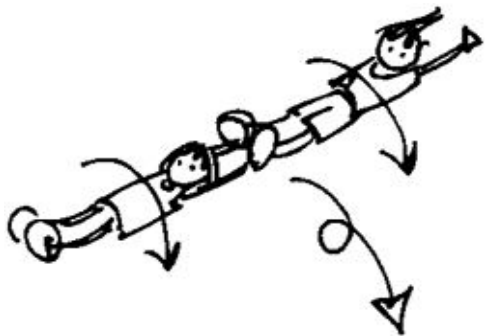

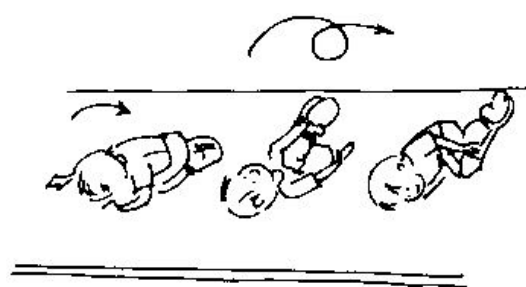
